Fishing regulation in Nunavik national parks*

Parc national des Pingualuit 2024-2025

1. **DEFINITIONS**

Beneficiary: A person enrolled as Beneficiary in accordance with the *Act respecting Cree, Inuit, and Naskapi Native Persons*.

James Bay and Northern Quebec Agreement (JBNQA): Signed in 1975, the JBNQA notably recognizes rights and privileges to Inuit Beneficiaries, gives them title to Category I lands (full ownership) and harvesting rights within defined areas of interest, and in an exclusive manner on Inuit Category I and II lands. Inuit Beneficiaries' harvesting rights are protected by this treaty, subject to the principle of conservation.

Resident of Quebec: Any Non-Beneficiary person domiciled in Québec and having resided there for a period of 183 days during the year previous to their sport fishing activities or application for a sport fishing license.

2. PERMITS

To sport fish within Parc national des Pingualuit, non-beneficiary visitors must have 2 valid permits.

- 1- Québec Provincial sport fishing license,
- 2- Park sport fishing authorization

2.1 Québec Provincial sport fishing licences

Any non-beneficiary sport fishing anywhere in the province of Québec must have a valid Québec Provincial Sport Fishing License and respect its regulations.

2.2 Park Sport Fishing Authorization

Any non-beneficiary sport fishing inside the park boundaries must have a valid Park Sport Fishing Authorization.

3. PARK POLICY ON SPORT FISHING IN PARC NATIONAL DES PINGUALUIT

The park policy on sport fishing in Parc national des Pingualuit is applicable to non-beneficiary visitors.

SPECIES ALLOWED*	Arctic char
	 Lake trout^a
CATCH LIMIT OF 3 FISH PER STAY*	 * All other species caught must be released. a Lake trout less than 60 cm (catch and possession limit of 3, one of which may be 60 cm and more) Regardless of the species for allowable species
	 only. Once the limit is reached, it is not possible to sport fish anymore. Catch and release sport fishing method is not allowed in the park.
	* Autonomous visitors in the backcountry are allowed to a possession limit of 3 fish regardless of the species for allowable species only. Once the limit is reached, the above regulation applies.
ONLY ONE (1) FISH CAN BE BROUGHT OUT OF THE PARK	 All the other catch must be consumed on site. Can keep specimen of less than 90 cm
FISHING AREAS	 Sport fishing is allowed in Natural environment zone and Services zone Sport fishing is prohibited in Preservation zone and Maximum preservation zone
FISHING METHOD	One line with one hook

4. SUMMER FISHING PERIOD

Sport fishing period in zone 23 North, including Parc national des Pingualuit

Species	2024	
Arctic char	From June 1st to Contember 2nd	
Lake trout	From June 1 st to September 2 nd	

5. WINTER FISHING PERIOD

Please note that WINTER SPORT FISHING IS ALLOWED inside the park boundaries for non-beneficiary visitors accompanied by park's guides under certain conditions. **Non-beneficiaries are required to register their catch** in the booklet: *Winter Sport Fishing by Non-Beneficiaries: Monitoring Program*. Otherwise, this authorization is not valid. Winter sport fishing by non-beneficiaries is authorized only on the following lakes: Qikirtatualik (Lac St-Germain), Tasialuk (Lac Vergons) and Qamanikutaaq (on the Rivière Vachon).


